

A new layout was introduced in November that allows for more vendors and provides more traffic at all vendors booths.

PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT

- Bridge Renovation Nature Trail Bridge Bridge Near Grogan's Mill Shopping Center: The
 Grogan's Mill bridge renovation continues and is expected to be completed in the first quarter
 of 2022. The delays on this project are largely related to supply shortages and longer than
 normal lead times.
- <u>Streetscapes Program</u>: Over the course of the past 18 months, the streetscape programs has been under review and the current contract with BrightView expires in December 2021. The Board approved two bids- one with BrightView (Right of Way Mowing and Entrances) and one with Berkley (Town Center). Township staff will provide trash removal on the rights of way. It is estimated that this program will save \$450,000 per year while enhancing the standards and specifications for this program.
- Capital 2022: The Board of Directors approved the following projects in Grogan's Mill for 2022.
 - o Expanded Docks at Riva Row Boat House to handle the increased volume of kayak rentals.
 - o Sawmill and Loggers Hollow playgrounds will be replaced
 - o Grogan's Point Tennis Courts- Resurfacing
